For students who must be away from campus for periods of time during the school year. This scenario provides parents with the flexibility of online instruction and the ability to return to on-campus instruction.


OPTION 3 ONLINE CAMPUS (Full Year Distance Learning)

ON-CAMPUS LEARNING - OPTION 1



What we are currently planning for On-Campus Learning:

- Arrival and dismissal times will be staggered with extended pick-up and drop-off times (See Page 20)
- Daily screening of symptoms and temperature checks will be performed each morning
- Elementary students will report directly to their class (See Page 21)
- Preschool students may be dropped off at the classroom door by a parent (See Page 21)
- All classes will remain in cohorts and not mix with other classes
- Playground and outdoor recess times will not include mixing students from other classes
- Our classrooms will provide socially distanced seating and plenty of outdoor learning spaces
- Students will be taught outdoors as much as possible
- There will be no assemblies or large group activities, unless with proper social distancing and preferably outdoors
- Chapel services will be held on a virtual format for all students
- Regular hand washing and sanitizing will be scheduled throughout the day
- Lunch will be available for students to enjoy in one of our many outdoor seating areas
- Face coverings will be required in specific spaces and times (See Page 13)
- All afterschool athletics and clubs will be postponed until further notice (See Page 29)
- Virtual field trips will be favored, while local field trips are subject to social distancing guidelines
- Any travel outside of the local area is limited to essential travel with notification provided to the administration

HYBRID LEARNING - OPTION 2 (Temporary Online Learning)



Our hybrid learning option is for students with health related concerns who may need to be away from campus for periods of time during the school year. Should any of these situations arise, we will transition the student to remote learning immediately. We are working alongside our teachers to offer a hybrid model that will blend synchronous and asynchronous academic opportunities for students who are temporarily learning from home.

The Hybrid learning is available on a month-to-month basis. Students who start the year on the hybrid model can choose to return to full-time on-campus instruction on the available campus re-entry dates below.

ONLINE CAMPUS - OPTION 3

The online students will have access to their lead teacher and elective teachers on a daily basis with a low teacher-to-student ratio. Parents will have ongoing support from the classroom teachers and direct communication with our school administrators. Students will enjoy live class sessions in group settings, meet KCS classmates from around the country, and develop friendships with other likeminded students. This is a great option for those families who do not wish to return to campus for the 2020-2021 school year.

CAMPUS UPGRADES & ENHANCED TECHNOLOGY

Over \$50,000 has been invested for campus-wide health and safety upgrades and technology enhancements. These investments will help provide our students and faculty with a state of the art environment that is equipped with the technology necessary for effective hybrid and in person learning.



Microsoft Surface Pro computers for use by both our staff and students.



Swivel is an innovative camera technology that is currently used in over 40,000 schools worldwide. Swivel follows the teacher for automated lecture capture and will greatly enhance our hybrid learning environment for both students and teachers.



Several Newline Trutouch Interactive Boards have been purchased for many preschool classrooms. This technology will greatly assist our teachers by enhancing the hybrid synchronous learning model with better student/teacher interaction.



Handwashing stations have been installed throughout the campus. We've also invested in outdoor furniture to create six outdoor learning spaces.



Touchless hand sanitizing dispensers have been placed in each classroom and throughout the campus.





ADDITIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES



While it is impossible to eliminate all risks, best efforts to keep our faculty and students safe are happening. With safety as our highest priority, Kendall Christian School has invested in the following:

- Staffing Additional custodial staff has been hired to clean and sanitize high touch areas throughout the day.
- Additional Sinks and Sanitizer Dispensers Handwashing stations have been placed throughout the campus to allow for regularly scheduled handwashing throughout the day. In addition, touchless hand sanitizing dispensers have been placed in each classroom and throughout the campus.
- Furniture We have purchased additional classroom and outdoor furniture in order to create appropriate spacing and unidirectional seating. Many picnic tables have been added to create more areas for outdoor instruction and lunch.
- Technology Classrooms are being outfitted to include audio and video equipment that will allow students in remote environments the ability to synchronously participate in classes being held in person. Also, Interactive boards have been added to all Pre-K3 classrooms, and 25 additional surface pro computers have been purchased for student and staff use.
- **UV Air Sanitation Systems** Our campus is being retrofitted with the latest Photohydroionization technology (PHI). The PHI cell in combination with enhanced UV light produces safe hydrogen peroxides to purify the air.
- **Enhanced Cleaning** We will be initiating a nightly schedule to sanitize all areas utilizing EPA approved disinfectant products against COVID-19.
- **Personal Protection Equipment (PPE)** KCS has invested in Personal Protective Equipment to be used at the discretion of the classroom teacher. These items include gloves, masks, face shields, and acrylic dividers.

FACE COVERINGS



Face coverings will be required by all faculty, staff, elementary students and as feasible by preschool students when they are unable to maintain social distancing while on campus (i.e. during drop-off and pick-up, while walking through hallways, during bathroom breaks, etc.). Faculty and staff will be required to wear face masks/face coverings throughout the school day. While education will be provided to students on proper face mask use, families are expected to reinforce these guidelines at home and are encouraged to begin educating their children prior to the start of school. More information on proper face mask use can be found on the CDC web-<u>site</u>.

Face coverings are part of the school uniform and will be available for purchase through our Knights Vault. Parent provided face coverings are permitted, however, we request that they be multiple layers and a solid color; other than those sold through our school.



TEAM ASSIGNMENTS:

Students entering Kindergarten—5th grade who are not presently part of a team will be assigned one during the first week of school. All preschool students are a part of Team Bears.

UPDATED HEALTH PROCEDURES



Return-to-school Screenings:

In an effort to minimize illness, we ask that all families check on the health of each student daily beginning 14 days prior to the start of school. If any fever and/or symptoms are present during the 14-day period, please have your child evaluated by their pediatrician for medical clearance and submit that clearance note to the school nurse. All clearance notes will be required upon initial drop-off on the first day of school.

* Potential COVID-19 Symptoms:

Fatigue Fever Cough Headache Shortness of Breath Muscle/Body aches Nasal Congestion Poor appetite Loss of smell/taste Diarrhea

Nausea and/or vomiting

Other: rash, red eyes, cracked/swollen lips, red/swollen tongue, swelling of hands/feet, stomach pain.

Signed Acknowledgement of Risk:

Kendall Christian School will require a signed formal acknowledgement form that you are aware of the risks inherent in each plan and that you accept the risk. While KCS will make its best efforts to prevent COVID-19 infection, we cannot completely mitigate the risk for anyone attending Kendall Christian. You have the option to choose online learning. The Acknowledgement of Risk form is included in the return to school selection form.

Daily Health Screenings:

During the new drop-off procedures, all students will have a temperature and symptom screening performed prior to each student exiting their car. Any student presenting with a temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher will not be permitted on campus. Please refer to our Protocol for **COVID and Other Illnesses** page for more specific guidelines on our protocols.

Travel Guidelines:

Due to the continued spread of COVID-19 in our community and world-wide, travel (both domestic and international) is still recommended to be restricted to "essential travel" only. Anyone returning from international travel must self-isolate at home for 14 days from the date of arrival, and will not be permitted on campus. If a household member returns from international travel and is unable to isolate from a student, the student will also be asked to self-isolate until the 14-day period ends. For the most up-to-date travel guidelines and restrictions, please visit the CDC or FDOH websites.

Immunizations and Health Forms:

Physicians are continuing to encourage families to keep their child/children's scheduled well visit appointments. For this reason, all immunizations are required to be up to date in order for a student to attend school.

If an outbreak of a vaccine preventable communicable disease occurs, any child who is not fully immunized (whether for medical or religious exemption) for that particular disease will be required to stay home until it is deemed safe to return by the Department of Health.

Asthma Care and Nebulizer Treatments:

Due to the risk of Aerosolized Transmissible Diseases (ATD) with COVID-19, any previously ordered nebulizer treatment will need to be converted to an inhaler with a spacer attachment. If a student requires nebulizer treatments during the day, they should stay home until symptoms have resolved and there is no longer a need for said treatment.



PROTOCOL FOR COVID & OTHER ILLNESSES



The following guidelines will be implemented for all staff, faculty and students.

If you had a fever but no other symptoms related to COVID-19, you can return to campus only after:

- Three (3) days with no fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication) AND either:
 - -You provide a written clearance from a physician
 - -OR two subsequent negative COVID test results in a row, at least 24 hours apart

If you think or know that you had COVID-19 and had symptoms, you can return to campus only after:

- Three (3) days with no fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication) AND either:
 - -Respiratory symptoms have improved (e.g. cough, shortness of breath) and
 - -10 days since symptoms first appeared and you provide a written clearance from a physician
 - -OR two subsequent negative COVID test results in a row, at least 24 hours apart

If you tested positive for COVID-19, had no symptoms, and continue to have no symptoms, you can return to campus only after:

- You have notified the school AND either
 - -10 days have passed since the positive test and you provide a written clearance from a physician
 - -OR two subsequent negative COVID test results in a row, at least 24 hours apart

If you have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19, you can return to campus only after:

• 14 days

Close contact is defined as follows:

- You are within six (6) feet of someone who has COVID-19 for at least 15 minutes starting from 48 hours before illness onset until the time the person is isolated with no other interventions. (e.g. face coverings)
- You live with someone who has COVID-19.
- You had direct physical contact with someone who has COVID-19 (touching, hugging, or kissing).
- You shared eating or drinking utensils with someone who has COVID-19.
- Someone who has COVID-19 sneezed or coughed on you.

Once community incidences of new cases decrease we will change the exclusion timeframe from 72 to 24 hours, provided no temporary school closures take place during this time.

AFTERSCHOOL CARE SAFETY MEASURES



Students enrolled in aftercare will remain in cohort groups during afterschool care. Each group will have a separately designated outdoor recess time and area. Our aftercare staff will receive proper training regarding our health and safety measures. Detailed information regarding the afterschool care pick-up procedures will be announced the week before school starts. Afterschool care is available until 6:00 PM. **Students must** be pre-enrolled to participate in aftercare.

SCHOOL CLOSURE TUITION CREDIT



In the event of a government mandated pandemic related school closure, we have revised our 2020-2021 school year financial information to reflect a tuition credit for each day of distance learning in the event our campus is closed. Daily credits during the school year would be applied to your future monthly statement for days we cannot meet on-campus.



DAILY DROP-OFF & PICK-UP



Preschool—Kindergarten

Drop-off procedures:

After much discussion, we have decided that the safest option for our preschool and kindergarten students is to allow one parent to walk them to their classroom door. The drop-off times are between 7:45 AM and 8:15 AM. Families will be able to select their preferred drop-off time (7:45 AM, 8:00 AM, or 8:15 AM). Please note, the 8:15 AM drop-off time would only be applicable for preschool. Parents must wear a mask when on campus and must maintain their social distance from others while on campus with only a few parents at a time allowed in the hallway. Parents are not allowed to enter the classroom and we kindly ask that you please drop-off as quickly as possible. Teachers will be in their classroom receiving students during the drop-off times.

Pick-up procedures:

The pick-up procedures will closely resemble the morning drop-off procedures. For the time being, only one parent will be allowed to enter the building to pick-up or drop-off. The pick-up times are listed above. Students on campus after 3:45 PM will be checked into our afterschool care program. Parents must wear a mask when on campus and must maintain their social distance from others while on campus with only a few parents at a time allowed in the hallway. Students will remain in their classroom during the pick-up times.

1st—5th Grade

Drop-off procedures:

For the safety of our school community, at present, elementary school parents (1st-5th Grade) will not be permitted to walk their child to their classroom. Parents can choose to drop-off at any of our carline drop-off areas or you may park and walk your child to our security and health check entry point. We will continually reevaluate this procedure as the pandemic circumstances change for the better. Teachers will be in their classroom receiving students during the drop-off times.

Pick-up procedures:

For the safety of our school community, at present, elementary school parents (1st—5th Grade) will not be permitted to pick-up their child from the classroom. Parents can choose to pick-up using our carline option or designated outdoor pick-up area. Students on campus after 3:45 PM will be checked into our afterschool care program. We will continually reevaluate this procedure as the pandemic circumstances change for the better. Students will remain in their classroom during the pick-up times.

Carline Drop-Off Areas

Students in 1st—5th grade can be received at the front main entrance between 7:00 AM—8:00 AM. Students in Preschool and Kindergarten can be received on the north side carline entrance between 7:45—8:45 AM.



BACK TO SCHOOL INFORMATION



SCHOOL OFFICE HOURS

The school office is open daily from 7:45 AM to 3:30 PM. Due to the limited space in our office and current social distancing requirements, please call to make an appointment if you need to meet with someone from the administration.

LATE ARRIVALS AND EARLY PICK-UP

Students arriving late need to check-in through the school office. They will have their temperature checked, and a school employee will accompany them to their classroom.

If you need to pick-up your child early from school, please call the front office when you are in the parking lot. We will call your child from class and you can meet them outside the main office.

PARKING

Parents may park in designated parking areas only and must have a decal. PLEASE, DO NOT PARK ON THE GRASS OR IN THE DRIVE-THROUGH AREAS. PARKING ALONG 112TH STREET, AND PARKING IN A HANDICAPPED SPACE WITHOUT A HANDICAPPED DECAL IS NOT PERMITTED. Vehicles which obstruct traffic, or create a unsafe traffic flow are subject to being towed.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

For a complete list of school supplies by grade level, visit the KCS website. For families that have purchased their school supply pack through the school, your child's supplies will be delivered directly to their classroom before school starts.

CLASS LIST/STUDENT PLACEMENT

Student placement into classes is based upon several factors. Students are placed based upon teacher recommendations, personal abilities, boy/girl ratios, educational, and emotional needs. We use a set criteria as a priority in placement. All inquiries should be directed to the administration and never the teacher. If parents have social or academic input concerning their child, it must be submitted in writing. By policy, parents MAY NOT request a specific teacher. Public discussion of placement among parents or staff is deemed inappropriate and divisive. Your concerns are important to us, so please contact a school administrator so we can properly address your concerns. Class placement is confidential until families receive an email from their child's teacher the week before school starts.

CHAPEL SERVICES

For the time being, all in person chapel services have been suspended. Our on-campus and online students will have the opportunity to participate in virtual chapel services every Thursday morning for our elementary students, and on Friday mornings for all our preschool students.

DRESS CODE POLICY



At Kendall Christian School we believe that cleanliness, personal appearance, and modest dress are very important in setting the pattern of school and social conduct. All uniforms should be modest, clean, well-fitting, and in good repair. We believe there is a close relationship between student dress and student behavior. Our standardized dress code is established to remind parents and children that KCS students are to present themselves in a well-dressed manner at all times.

I. Where to Purchase Uniforms

Our school has a contract with AA/Dennis Uniforms to provide uniforms for our students. They are located at 8820 SW 131 St., Miami, Florida. You can reach them at (305) 254-0000. Dennis Uniforms has a copy of our student dress code for easy shopping. Uniforms must be purchased from AA/Dennis Uniforms ONLY (with the exception of school t-shirt sales). Visit the AA/Dennis Uniforms website at www.dennisuniform.com.

II. HAIR AND JEWELRY

- Boys' and girls' hair must not be long enough to obstruct vision in any way, and boys' hair must be off the collar.
- All hair styles must be neat.
- Modest jewelry, earrings and rings are permitted. Please do not wear any heirloom pieces or expensive jewelry to school.
- Certain hair styles are not permitted. Example: no mohawks, razor patterns, colored hair, etc.

III. CLOTHING REGULATIONS:

- Clothing should not be oversized or undersized.
- Shorts, skorts and skirts. Not shorter than 4 inches from the back of the knee, not longer than 1 inch below the knee.
- **Shoes and Socks:** Sneakers are preferred, no sling-back or clog-type shoes, no Heelys, no open-toe shoes (i.e. sandals or crocs), no heels, and no light up shoes. Socks must be worn, either white or coordinating colors.
- Belts are required for boys and girls if shirts are tucked in.
- Shirts may be un-tucked if they are properly fitted. No oversized shirts may be worn un-tucked.
- Visors or baseball caps may be worn outside only for protection from the sun during recess or physical education.
- KCS T-shirts, purchased from PTF, will be allowed on designated days.
- Jeans or school uniform shorts may be worn only on Fridays with a KCS T-shirt.








CAMPUS MAP
